The CNPA Foundation, a California-based 501(c)(3) corporation, Federal Tax ID number 68-0313934, was founded in 1993 as a subsidiary corporation of the California Newspaper Publishers Association (CNPA). The CNPA Foundation raises funds through tax-deductible contributions and disburses those funds for educational purposes relating to the publishing and information dissemination business.

In Winter 2009, the Foundation funded eight \$1,000 grants for college interns who will secure 2010 internships at California newspapers. Since 1995, 135 students have received Foundation internship grants.

The Foundation in 2010-11 will provide grants totaling \$17,000 to improve production hardware and software at high school and college newspapers and provided individual and group grants to high school newspaper advisers for production training. Directors have indicated a desire to increase support for equipment grants and less focus on individual internship grants.

Internship grants are funded from interest earned by the Foundation endowment.

Same-year revenues help to provide equipment grants to high school and college newspapers and training grants to high school newspaper advisers.
